What you have learned in ELJ102

- Ch.06: Make requests (e.g., "Please eat sushi.")
- Ch.06: Ask for and give permission (e.g., "You may eat sushi.")
- Ch.06: Talk about rules and regulations (e.g., "You may not eat sushi.")
- Ch.06: Offer help (e.g., "Let me teach you Japanese.")
- Ch.06: Give reasons (e.g., "I eat sushi because I am in Japan.")

Review of Ch.1-Ch.10 (3)

What you have learned in ELJ102 (cont.)

- Ch.07: Talk about families and friends (e.g., "My brother is married.")
- Ch.07: Describe how people are dressed and how they look (e.g., "My brother wears a red shirt.")
- Ch.08: Express thoughts and opinions (e.g., "I think Takeshi drinks coffee.")
- Ch.08: Report someone's speech (e.g., "Takeshi said Mary drinks coffee.")

Review of Ch.1-Ch.10 (4)

What you have learned in ELJ102 (cont.)

- Ch.08: Request not to do (e.g., "Please do not drink coffee.")
- Ch.08: Talk about things we like/dislike to do (e.g., "I like drinking coffee.")
- Ch.09: Give reasons (e.g., "I drink coffee because I am sleepy.")
- Ch.09: Talk about past events (short form) (e.g., "I ate sushi.")

Review of Ch.1-Ch.10 (5)

What you have learned in ELJ102 (cont.)

- Ch.09: Describe the details of an item/person (modifying a noun) (e.g., "My friend who drinks coffee went to Starbucks.")
- Ch.10: Compare things and people (e.g., "Nintendo Switch is better than PS")
- Ch.10: Talk about future plans (e.g., "I will buy new Nintendo Switch.")
